This Sunday we will reflect on the theme of racial justice. Andy and JJ welcome Marshall Mandiangu to join us for this one.

Marshal is a 2x award-nominated music artist, accomplished actor with two sold-out shows, a freestyle model and an astrologer. A 25-yearold born and bred in West London, now living in Brighton; his sense of life and art is based on the stars, community and living in the unapologetic truth of his existence. His latest compilation following the critically-acclaimed "Unapologetically Black" speaks about the black experience: joy, heartbreak, grief, mental health and topics of the taboo given the light of day.
