Racial Justice Sunday Last week we were lucky enough to have JJ speaking on racial issues and sharing with us how he feels as the father of an eleven-year-old girl at the news of a racial attack on a black schoolgirl outside a school in Ashford, Surrey, Most of us were unaware it had even happened; the



images were shocking. And Marshall Mandiangu, who not only sang to us a song of his ancestors, as well as one of his own compositions, but very movingly blessed our church in prayer. He and JJ also emphasised the need to stand up to racism out in the world.
