Circuit Refugee Project Update

Across the Circuit, we are busy planning more fundraising events and also our Refugee Sunday services on 25 June.

Ruth has new stock of the fundraising notecards for sale, (£1 each or 6 for ± 5 cash please on sale after Sunday service). The art work was designed by local international women (pictured),

at the Network for International Women (NiW) Art Class. NiW is the local refugee charity Ruth liaises with most. She has witnessed the amazing work they do with sanctuary seeking people staying in local hotels, at the Sanctuary Afternoon at All Saints, the Art Class and also a Mindfulness Class out in open nature in Stanmer Park.

Ruth accepts donations of toiletries at any time and plans a



special call for toiletry donations on Refugee Sunday (June 25th).

Local refugee charities use Emmaus, as well as other local initiatives, to help refugees set up home once their asylum has been granted. Emmaus Brighton & Hove have a great list on their website of items they DO want donating and a 'No Thanks' list of stuff they are not taking at the moment.

Local charities, both Voices in Exile and Conversation-across-Borders are appealing for volunteers. Go to their websites or ask Ruth if you would like more detail of the kind of voluntary work involved.

For example, Voices in Exile have specialist case workers for the complex case work, but they need volunteers for helping people with more straightforward forms such as applying to the council for furniture needed. Apparently a bed is not deemed an essential item and has to be applied for! **Ruth Samur**

Immigration bill - second reading

This bill just passed its second reading in the House of Lords. The bill is not popular with refugee and church groups. The Methodist Church has stated "We are appalled by the proposals in the government's 'Illegal Migration Bill' to detain, punish and reject thousands of people seeking safety. They are completely incompatible with our Christian conviction that all human beings are made in the image of God, and are therefore inherently worthy of treatment which honours their dignity... If ever there was a contemporary example of ignoring our neighbour and walking by on the other side, this is it." And so we are a church of Sanctuary, doing what we can to support people affected by this punitive legislation.
