

What an incredibly generous donation with so many thoughtful ideas around making culturally relevant food parcels. With this food you will be helping 32 families this week, about 83 people,





including 39 children. Brilliant work! Thanks for your support.' Meanwhile at Stanford Avenue's Flowerpot Festival, with help from our Ukrainian friend Olga, Ruth created a celebration of Ukraine's nightingales. Nightingales are common in Ukraine and their beautiful song is celebrated in Ukrainian folklore, poems
