Gloria, Gloria....Hallelujah!!

The MRI scan I had last week showed the bleed on my brain is drying up, and the ultrasound revealed no blood clots. There has been progress with movement in my toes and some improvement in walking.

I can now move from lying down to sitting up on my side (with nurse supervision) and am using a wheelchair (though not very well yet!). I'm also starting to walk with the help of hoists, thanks to the trainers Jenny brought me. I'm still paralyzed from above the knee to the armpit, but I've already met the first two goals the team set for me, which were meant to take two weeks — I've achieved them in just two days!

I even joined the art group and gave a lesson to two occupational therapists! I'm fighting hard and aiming to walk out of here by my predicted discharge date of 14th February.
